They ensure that students understand their work, know their objectives, and exhibit positive learning behaviors to make progress. Working under the guidance of a qualified teacher, they provide individual and small group instruction using various strategies to support learners with different abilities. Additionally, they may assist students with special educational needs, disabilities, as well as those facing social, emotional, and mental health challenges.

- Support the development of a stimulating and safe learning environment
- Support the social, emotional, mental health, wellbeing and personal care of all learners
- Deliver individual and small group teaching
- Contribute to assessment and planning
- Promote diversity, inclusion, equality and acceptance of all learners in line with school policies
- Understand the specific needs of learners and use strategies to support all learners to achieve their learning goals
- Implement safeguarding policies and safe practice
- Promote engagement and teach learning behaviours
